SONIQ Smart TV END USER SOFTWARE LICENCE AGREEMENT - IMPORTANT, READ CAREFULLY BEFORE PROCEEDING

This is a licence agreement between You and Soniq granting you a licence to use the Software. By using the Software you are deemed to have accepted the terms of this Agreement. If you do not accept the terms of this Agreement do not use the Software.

Soniq does not store an individual copy of this Agreement entered into with you and we recommend that You save a local copy of this Agreement for Your own record. A copy of this Agreement can be found at www.soniq.com.au/terms If you are under 18 years of age you must obtain a parent/guardian's consent before using the Software.

1. Definitions

In this Agreement:

"Agreement" means this licence agreement between You and Soniq comprising the terms You accept by using the Software:

"Authorised Purposes" means the non-commercial use by You of the Software as a platform to access Content;

"Content" means content provided by both Soniq and third parties via the internet that You access using the Software;

"Smart TV" means the television sets produced by Soniq that are capable of connecting to, and downloading content from, the internet through the use of the Software.

"Software" means the software integrated into Sonig's Smart TV sets;

"Soniq" means Quatius Digital Media Pty Ltd (ACN 133 185 681) trading as Soniq;

"Term" means the period beginning on the date you accept this Agreement and ending on termination of the Agreement in accordance with clause 6;

"Third Party Content" means any Content that is created by someone other than Soniq; and

"You" or "Your" means you or any user of the Software.

2. Licence

- 2.1 Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, Soniq grants to You a non-exclusive and non-transferable licence during the Term to use the Software for the Authorised Purposes.
- 2.2 Use of the Software signifies Your acceptance of this Agreement.
- 2.3 Any use of the Software other than as expressly authorised by this Agreement, or any resale or further distribution of the Software by You, constitutes a material breach of this Agreement and may violate applicable copyright law.

3. Changes to this Agreement

- 3.1 Soniq is permitted to alter this Agreement from time to time by giving You seven (7) days notice.
- 3.2 Your continued use of the Software after the notice period ends constitutes your acceptance of the modified Agreement.
- 3.3 If You do not accept the modified Agreement you must immediately stop using the Software.

4. Restrictions on use

- 4.1 You must not, and must not permit any third party to:
 - (a) access or duplicate the Software for any purpose other than as reasonably necessary to use the Software as contemplated by this Agreement;
 - (b) publish the Software, or use the Software other than for the Authorised Purposes;
 - (c) except as expressly authorised by law, reverse engineer, disassemble, decompile, translate, reconstruct, transform or extract the Software or any portion of the Software;
 - (d) except as expressly authorised by law or as permitted using the Software's standard menu option, change, modify or otherwise alter the Software including by disabling any feature or blocking any advertisement or message intended to be displayed;

- (e) transfer, pledge, rent, share or sublicense the Software;
- (f) defeat or circumvent, attempt to defeat or circumvent, or authorize or assist any third party in defeating or circumventing controls on the use of copies of the Software; or
- (g) engage in any conduct or activity that may cause damage to the Software, disrupt access to the Software or otherwise interfere or affect the performance of the Software.

5. Access and support

- 5.1 You are responsible for accessing and using the Software. Soniq is not obligated to provide You with any services or technical support in relation to the Software under this Agreement.
- 5.2 Soniq may at any time and in its sole discretion:
 - (a) disable or suspend Your access to the Software; or
 - (b) screen, filter, review, modify, block or refuse access to any Content that may be accessed by the Software, but is under no obligation to do so.

6 Termination

- 6.1 Without prejudice to any of its other rights, Soniq shall be entitled to terminate the licence granted by this Agreement without liability:
 - (a) on five (5) days notice to You, at Soniq's sole discretion; or
 - (b) for cause at any time without notice if You commit a material breach of this Agreement.
- 6.2 You may terminate this Agreement on seven (7) days notice by giving notice to Soniq at support@soniq.com.au or by permanently ceasing to use the Smart TV.
- 6.3 The termination of this Agreement does not affect any rights, obligations or liabilities that Soniq has accrued under the Agreement prior to termination.
- 6.4 On the expiration or termination of this Agreement, Soniq will terminate Your access to the Software. Sections 4, 7, 10, 12,13, and 14 will survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

7.I ntellectual Property

- 7.1 Content provided by Soniq forms part of Soniq's intellectual property.
- 7.2 Soniq reserves all rights in the Software not expressly granted by this Agreement. All copyrights, trademarks and other conceivable intellectual property rights in and to the Software (including, but not limited to, all code, data files, images appearing in the Software and screen displays as well as any and all documentation relating to the Software) are owned or licensed by Soniq, and are protected by law.
- 7.3 Third Party Content may be subject to third party intellectual property rights, including but not limited to copyright, trade mark and design rights.
- 7.4 The licence granted by this Agreement is a bare licence to use the Software and does not grant any right in Soniq's intellectual property or any third party intellectual property displayed or accessed via the Software.
- 7.5 Soniq does not authorise any act that would infringe Soniq's intellectual property or any third party intellectual property rights including but not limited to the reproduction, distribution, sale, modification or grant of licence in any intellectual property owned by a third party.
- 7.6 You hereby indemnify Soniq for all loss and damage suffered by it due to Your breach of any of Soniq's or a third party's intellectual property rights.

8. Internet Usage

- 8.2 Soniq uses the Software to promote goods and services offered by Soniq and third parties. These advertisements will require You to download Content from the Internet and may incur costs from Your internet service provider.


Connect the power cord directly to the wall outlet.

If the unit will not be used for a long period of time, it should be unplugged from the wall outlet.





Remote Control

Using the Remote control


When using the remote control, aim it at remote control sensor window with the unit. If there is an object between the remote control and the signal remote control sensor window on the unit, the remote may not operate.

- ▶ When using the remote control, please note:
- Do not strike or drop the remote. Do not expose the remote control to liquids and do not place it in humid environments.
- Do not install or place the remote control in direct sunlight. The heat may damage the remote control
- If the remote control sensor window on the unit is in direct sunlight or strong light, the remote control may not operate normally. In this situation, change the light source or read just the angle of your unit, or operate the remote control from a location closer to the remote control sensor window on the display.

Batteries

You will need to install the supplied batteries into the remote control to make it operate following the instructions below.

- 1. Open the lid of the remote control battery compartment.
- 2. Insert two size-AAA batteries.
 Ensure that the batteries are inserted with the positive and negative terminals in the correct direction corresponding to the (+) and (-) marks in the battery compartment.



Notes on Using Batteries

The use of the wrong type of batteries may cause chemical leaks and/or explosion. Please note the following:

Always ensure that the batteries are inserted with the positive and negative terminals in the correct direction as shown in the battery compartment.

Different types of batteries have different characteristics. Do not mix different types.

Troubleshooting

Before calling a service center, attempt the following steps to diagnose the problem.

TV unit

Problem	Suggested Action
There is no power.	Ensure the power plug is securely inserted into the unit and wall outlet.
There is no picture or sound.	 Try a different input source to check whether the source is at fault. Check for mis-connection of cables or for wrong input source.
There are spots on the screen.	Your unit is being affected by interference from automobiles, trains, high-voltage transmission lines, neon signs or another sources of interference. Try redirecting or relocating your antenna to reduce the affects of the interference.
Degraded colors or tints.	Check whether all the picture adjustments have been properly performed.
Improper screen position or size.	Try selecting a different aspect ratio by pressing the ASPECT button on the remote control.
The image appears distorted.	Ensure the display aspect ratio is correctly set to suit the program source.
The image appears too bright, and there is a loss of definition in the brightest areas of the image.	 Reduce the contrast setting. The AV video signal has not been terminated properly somewhere in the external AV equipment.
The image appears too washed out, or the darkest areas of the image appear too bright.	Reduce the brightness level till the black areas of the picture appear as black.
Remote control does not function properly.	 Check for incorrect battery orientation. Check for dead batteries. Check your distance and angle from the display. Check whether remote control is pointing at sensor window. Check for any obstacle between the remote control and the remote control sensor window. Check that the remote control sensor window is not under strong fluorescent lighting. Check for any devices (PC or personal digital assistant, PDA) nearby that transmit infrared signal which may cause interference to signal transmission between the remote control and the unit. Turn off the infrared function of these devices.
There is no picture or sound, just noise.	Make sure the antenna cable is properly connected.Change channels to conrirm if the symptom is still present.
Picture is not clear.	 Make sure the antenna cable is properly connected. Change channels to confirm if the symptom is still present. If PC (VGA) is selected as the input signal source, use the Auto Sync Function in the Set Up Menu (In VGA Mode) to let the display adjust picture automatically.
No sound.	 Check whether you have selected the Mute function. Make sure the volume is not set to minimum. Check the AV cables for disconnection.
